
I Kings and Isaiah 11

I Kings is divided into two parts: The Glorious Reign of Solomon and The **Dividing** of the Kingdom of Israel.

Isaiah 11 is similarly divided: The Glorious Reign of Jesus Christ and the **Regathering** of the Nation of Israel.

A _____ of Kingdoms

Solomon's reign was the last time Israel was a complete (undivided) nation. The reign of Jesus Christ will bring the Nation of Israel together again, this time permanently. While the last half of I Kings details a divided kingdom of disaster, Isaiah 11's final verses detail a kingdom of unity and success.

Contrast with verses 12-13, remembering that Israel (northern kingdom) is regularly referred to as Ephraim by the prophets.
