

Intro to the Prophets

There are _____ books of prophecy in the Old Testament, _____ of which are considered “Major Prophets,” and _____ are considered “Minor Prophets.”

The major prophets are so named due to the _____ of their books, not necessarily the content.

Although Daniel is not particularly long, his book is generally grouped in the major prophets due to the great deal of prophecy given in 12 short chapters.

We will be filling out a chart today that places the prophetic books in the time frame in which they were written and to whom.

**The prophets are not necessarily in chronological order. Note that the order in which they are compiled in the Bible is first by “Major” or “Minor” Division, then in order from pre-exile to post-exile.
